Gerardo Renzetti is a distinguished Argentinean professional with more than 30 years of experience in Information Technology and Business. His formal education started in the National University of La Plata, Argentina, continuing his specialization in foreign universities. He opted for information systems consultancy, knowledge administration, multicultural leadership and information governance.

His work experience began in 1979, being only 18 years old he started working in the data center of the National University of La Plata. Since then, he played different and evolutionary roles in a small group of companies until 1991, when he decided to leave his comfortable position in a high level multinational in order to found his first company, ZETTI System Engineering, which he sold to an economic group related to the health sector in 2000.

Later, he founded VIT4B Software Factory, at the same time he started working and participating actively in the creation of Polos Informáticos, as well as the development and planning of the connections between the state, the University and IT SMEs. In 2004, he founded IT Quality, a company of quality consultancy which, together with VIT4B, became the productive core of Tekne Group, of which today he is the current president. In 2006 he started moving towards international relationships and he succeeded in 2007 with the foundation of ESICenter Cono Sur (*), a center with international excellence in r+d with its origin in the European Community, he is its director, and in 2008 with the launch of the community of Morfeo Cono Sur (*) free software communities, of which he is the president.
